Objective

- Review DPM 2.1.35 Electronic Control Device (ECD)
 Protocols and make recommendation in line with PERF recommendation.
- "ECWs should be clearly marked (brightly colored) and easily identifiable as a less-lethal option. It is recognized, however, that specialized units such as SWAT may prefer dark-colored ECWs for tactical concealment purposes." —PERF



Recommendation Highlights

 MPD should consider adopting brightly colored ECWs (e.g., yellow), which may reduce the risk of escalating a force situation because they are plainly visible and thus decrease the possibility that a secondary unit will mistake the ECW for a firearm.

Current Policy

- DPM 2.1.35- Section 7 (Carrying & Security):
- The ECD shall be carried in:
 - In a secured manner on the support side of the body.
 - An ECD holster or a secured pouch on the vest.
- No policy on color of the ECD. (Taser)



Gap Analysis

IACP: The ECW shall be carried in an approved holster on the side of the body opposite the service handgun.

Pros and Cons

List the reasons **for** adopting the recommendation

- Clear recognition of Less-Lethal tool
- Decrease possibility that ECW is confused for firearm.

List the reasons **against** adopting the recommendation

- Cost.
 - To exchange all current Black Taser X2 for Yellow Taser X2 would cost \$1.12 million. Currently in year 3 of 5 contract with AXON/Taser. Purchase Yellow Taser 7. \$1.68 million.



Proposed Action

• Recommend that MPD wait until the current contract expires with AXON/Taser. Purchase Yellow Tasers as a new policy directive at that time.
