### Recommendation Highlights

- The Mesa Police Department should identify the use of force incidents that require an automatic administrative investigation, regardless if a criminal investigation is required or not.
- In additional the Department should identify the administrative investigations that require unit notification, and prompt scene response or post scene review.

#### Gap Analysis

- Recommendation
  - A concurrent administrative investigation will begin automatically on critical incidents as qualified by the Department.
  - Immediate notification will be made to the Professional Standards Lieutenant immediately a critical use of force incident.

- Current Policy
  - The current policy does not mandate an administrative investigation be conducted
  - An administrative investigation is started under the following circumstances: concern from a use of force review by a supervisor, a citizen complaint, or a public records request.
    - Per Policy, the Professional Standards Lieutenant is notified:
      - Hospitalization Occurs
      - Allegation of excessive force

#### **Incident Types Requiring Administrative Investigation**

An incident involving deadly force\*

An incident involving serious injury/death to Officer\*

Use of force incident resulting in death\*

In-custody death\*

Application of carotid control technique\*\*

Use of force resulting in serious bodily injury\*

Intentional head strikes with an impact weapon or device\*

Unintentional (inadvertent or accidental) head strikes that results in serious bodily injury\*\*

Department canine deployment resulting in serious bodily injury\*\*

Officer-involved animal shootings\*\*

Unintentional firearm discharges\*\*

Driving Operations that result in death to driver or other party\*

Allegation of Excessive Force resulting in serious bodily injury or hospitalization\*

Category 3- Continues with current practice of Supervisor review

<sup>\*</sup>Category 1 Subcommittee recommendation for a prompt scene response to initiate an investigation.

<sup>\*\*</sup>Category 2 Subcommittee recommendation to complete a post scene review.

#### Committee Feedback

- Appropriate Staffing
  - If the LAPD model will be followed, the adequate staffing and dedicated full-time team should be implemented.



#### Further Analysis

- Request to quantify the number of incidents in 2018 based on the recommend incident types recommended for administrative review.
  - 54 Total Incidents (34 Incidents identified for prompt scene response)
    - 17 Deadly Force\*
    - 3 Carotid Applications
    - 2 In-Custody Death\*
    - 2 Intentional Head Strikes with Impact Weapon\*
    - 2 Unintentional Head Strikes resulting in Hospitalization
    - 13 Applications of Force Resulting in Serious Injury\*
    - 14 K9 Deployments with Injuries
    - 1 Precision Immobilization Technique Resulting in Injuries
- Request to define serious injury. It is recommended policy consider the definition in Arizona Revised Statutes.
  - ARS 13-105; includes physical injury that creates a reasonable risk of death, or that causes serious and permanent disfigurement, serious impairment of health or loss or protracted impairment of the function of any bodily organ or limb.



#### Further Analysis

- Maricopa County Attorney's Office Law Enforcement Liaison was contacted to discuss their agency's perspective on concurrent investigations and any potential issues that may arise.
  - Advised extreme care must be taken by the administrative investigators not to discuss or share anything they have learned with the criminal investigators.
- Estimate for implementation of overtime and standby pay for concurrent administrative investigations is approximately \$117,619.00, excluding vehicles.
  - Based on 34 total callout investigations per year



#### Final Guidance

- It is the recommendation of the committee the following incidents will require an administrative investigation with a scene response by the investigator:
  - · An incident involving deadly force
  - · Use of force incident resulting in death
  - In-custody death
  - Use of force resulting in serious bodily injury
  - Intentional head strikes with an impact weapon or device
- It is the recommendation of the committee the following incidents will require an administrative investigation with a post scene review by the investigator:
  - · Application of carotid control technique
  - Unintentional (inadvertent or accidental) head strikes that results in serious bodily injury
  - Department canine deployment resulting in serious bodily injury
  - Officer-involved animal shootings
  - Non-tactical unintentional firearm discharges
- The Professional Standards Lieutenant should be notified immediately following a qualified critical use of force incident and will coordinate with remaining members for scene response or post scene review.
