 Change Mesa Police Department Policy to require less-lethal shotguns be definitively marked to indicate they are less-lethal weapons.

- Department does not currently have any lethal-shotguns.
 - SWAT carries breaching shotguns.

Remington 870 12 Gauge Less Lethal Orange Over Molded Shotgun Stock w/fore-end (SKU: 08742) \$79.95

Currently there are 233 Remington 870 shotguns being deployed as less-lethal beanbag shotguns.

Total Cost \$18,628.35



Further Analysis

- IACP National Law Enforcement Policy Center
 - Specific deployment weapons shall be designated for deployment of impact projectiles and shall be definitively marked by paint or other conspicuous distinguishing features as authorized by this department.



Final Guidance

• Recommend the MPD revise policy and change all less-lethal shotguns to have orange colored stock and fore-end.
