
### Recommendation Highlights

- Each officer who was present at or witnesses a use of force should fill out a use of force report. The use of force report will then serve as a basis for adjudicating the propriety of the force.
- Establish assessment guidelines by which supervisors will evaluate non-critical use of force incidents.



#### Current Non-Critical Use of Force Review




### Proposed Non-Critical Use of Force Review: Roles Responsible for the Use of Force Report



### Advantages With Different Role(s)

Role	Advantage	Disadvantage
Involved Member	Firsthand knowledge of the force applied  Eliminate translation issue	Completion of additional document  Bias
Witnesses (Other Members)	Second set of facts	Conflicting accounts
		Different accounts/perspective
