Recommendation Highlights

• Clarify Under Which Circumstances Face, Head and Neck Strikes Are Permitted.

Gap Analysis

- Recommendation
- Provided additional direction in policy:
 - Face, Head and Neck Strikes Prohibited - absent active aggression/aggravated active aggression.

- Current Policy
- Strikes: Techniques that have more than a minimal chance of injury. (Examples: Kicks, elbow, palm or knee strikes, and punches). The officer will consider the totality of circumstances in evaluating which area of the body to strike.



Pros and Cons

List the reasons **for** adopting the recommendation

- Provide clear direction for officers.
- Adapt Special Order into permanent policy.

• Discussion on how officers respond to verbal aggression, that it is not the same as physical aggression.
