Recommendation Highlights

- Replace current references of "deadly force" to "lethal force.
- Change references of "non-deadly force" to "less-lethal" force.

Gap Analysis

- Currently the Mesa Police Department uses the terms that are consistent with the following:
 - Arizona Revised Statutes
 - AZ Post
- Term Less—lethal has become acceptable term used in lesson plans.



Pros and Cons

List the reasons **for** adopting the recommendation

• The term "less lethal" acknowledges the possibility that deaths have occurred as a result of less-lethal options.

List the reasons **against** adopting the recommendation

- Terms not used in lesson plans.
- Terms not used in AZ Revised Statutes.



Committee Feedback

 - Less lethal
 - Less than lethal
 - Physical force
 - Non-lethal



Further Analysis

- ARS regarding force, deadly force, justification, etc.
 - Last updated 1978
- Not contemporary with additional uses of "physical force".
 - Taser
 - Bean Bag
 - OC Spray



Final Guidance

- It is recommended that the Mesa Police Department continue to use the term deadly force.
- It is recommended that the Mesa Police Department implement the term less-lethal, and discontinue non-deadly force.
